CONFERENCES ON WORK & CANCER

The Midwest and National Conferences on Work & Cancer continue to address the myriad of issues faced by survivors in the workplace and during a job search. These free, day-long educational events bring together experts in the fields of career/employment, oncology, and more to cover relevant content and resources.

MIDWEST CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- 255 attendees from 34 states; 57.3% from Midwest Region
- 14 community partners
- 99.5% of attendees would recommend this conference to others
- 10 laptops distributed in 6 states: 80% of recipients are in active treatment

NATIONAL CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

- **800 attendees – the largest turnout in Conference history** – from 48 states/territories, D.C., Puerto Rico, and 13 countries
- 46 community partners
- 98.9%** of attendees would recommend this conference to others
- 38 laptops distributed in 21 states; 63.2% of recipients are in active treatment, and 47.4% identified as BIPOC

100+ job-seeking survivors received personalized feedback on their resumes.

BALANCING WORK & CANCER WEBINARS

CAC's monthly webinar series reaches survivors, caregivers, and healthcare professionals, providing them with vital education on job search, working through treatment, disclosure, and more. To date, 408 people have participated, 68% of whom are survivors, and 37.3% have attended more than one session.

EARLY CAREER SURVEY

CAC fielded a needs assessment of young adult (YA) cancer survivors (ages 18-40) to gain deeper insights into this demographic's unique challenges and experiences to complement the YA website channels created in 2024. With more than 500 respondents, the learnings from this survey will drive new resources and support for young adults managing work and cancer.

LOOKING AHEAD

Beyond delivering our annual programs and services, including the National & Midwest Conferences, resume reviews and Balancing Work & Cancer Webinars, Cancer and Careers looks forward to continuing to meet our community's needs in Q3 and Q4.

- For the 5th year in a row, present *Balancear el trabajo y el cancer*, a multi-part live, virtual series, providing our Spanish-speaking audience critical education and information in their preferred language.
- CAC will host two *In-Service Trainings for Healthcare Professionals*, providing accredited sessions focused on the practical and legal issues patients, survivors, and caregivers face when navigating work and cancer.
- The 11th annual *West Coast Conference on Work & Cancer* will be held virtually on October 25th. The program will also provide 10 laptops to people without a reliable device to support their ability to attend.
- First-ever *Cancer and Careers/Harris Poll* focused on understanding the work experiences of people diagnosed with cancer in the UK, Germany and France.
